



## **Notice to Bike Shops 2019 Summer Cycling**

Non-Motorized Bicycling is allowed on the Aldasoro Ranch Roads under the following circumstances.

Non-Motorized bikes only, no other forms of wheeled apparatus are allowed.

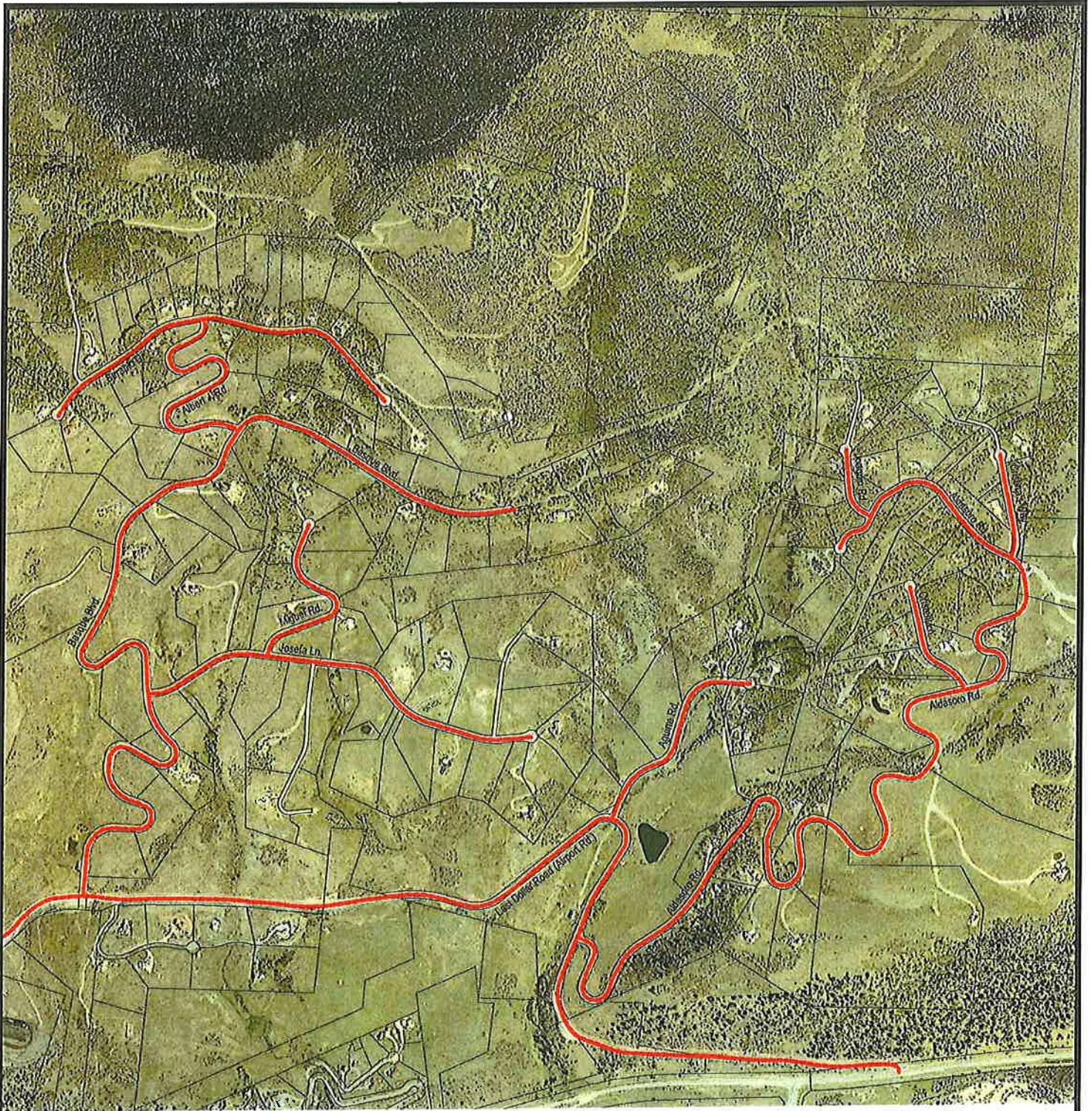
Bicyclists must ride along the Right Side of the paved road and follow traffic laws.

The rider must use the roads in a safe and careful manner, if not they will be asked to leave.

The public does not have the right to use any of the private Sunnyside Ranch Subdivision roads located within the gated and fenced portion of the subdivision. Nor is the public authorized to use any trails located within the Sunnyside Ranch Subdivision, including what is referred to as "Rudy Trail".

Be aware there is a significant amount of home building going on in Aldasoro so there will be increased construction traffic.

**Be safe, courteous and have a great ride!**

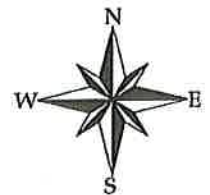


San Miguel County's Open Space and Recreation Program has secured a recreational easement for non-motorized cycling on the roads shown on the map above in red including Aldasoro Road, Cristelli Lane, Cristina's Way, Joaquin Road, Aguirre Road, Basque Blvd., Miguel Road, Josefa Lane, Albert J. Road, West Serapio Road, East Serapio Road.

In the Aldasoro Ranch Subdivision, the public is authorized to use each of the private roads in the subdivision for road bikes and a certain designated public single track trail accessible via a signed trailhead located off of Last Dollar Road .

In the Sunnyside Ranch Subdivision, the public is authorized to use the portion of private Aldasoro Road that crosses over the subdivision for road bikes.

Please respect private property. Stay on main roads and designated trails.
